



European Board of Transplantation Medicine

First Announcement

The 4th Exam for awarding the **European Diploma in Transplant Medicine** is organised by the European Board of Transplant Medicine of the Division of Transplantation of the UEMS in collaboration with the European Society of Organ Transplantation (ESOT).

Application starts March 15th, 2019 and is opened for both Junior and Senior transplant physicians <u>Deadline for application is June 15th, 2019</u>

Junior candidates

Junior transplant physicians should have a minimal 2-year training in transplantation medicine for applying. Juniors should apply for the Common Transplantation Medicine Module together with one or more of the Organ Modules: Kidney, Pancreas, Heart, Lung, Liver and Intestinal/Multivisceral Transplantation.

Final examination of eligible candidates will take place in Copenhagen on **14rd September 2019**, the day before ESOT meeting.

Senior candidates

Senior transplant physicians with at least 10 years of continuous experience as specialists practicing in formal nationally recognized posts are eligible to apply for an Honorary Diploma and be exempted of the examination.

Seniors can apply for the following modules: Kidney, Pancreas, Heart, Lung, Liver and Intestinal/Multivisceral Transplantation.
